Mrs. Daniels's legacy epitomizes academic excellence and service. After graduating valedictorian of her high school class, she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in English at Fort Valley State University. She continued to broaden her studies at several higher learning institutions including, Georgia State University, Florida State University and Georgia Southwestern College. She was a life-long learner; and education was at her core.

Mrs. Daniels's service in education started in the early 1950s. She retired from the Americus Public Schools System after a full and fruitful career of 27 years. Her work continues to echo today through the countless accomplishments of her students.

Her service poured outside the classroom and into the community.
